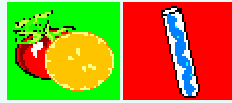

Get to know:



Carlos A. González - Chief of the Unit of Nutrition, Environment and Cancer at the Department of Epidemiology and Cancer Registration, Catalan Institute of Oncology (ICO) in Barcelona, Spain. Dr. González has more than 25 years of experience in epidemiological cancer research, being the author (co) of more than 150 scientific papers. He is the national coordinator of the European Prospective Investigation into Cancer and Nutrition (EPIC) in Spain and coordinator of an European EPIC project (EUR-GAST) on Nutrition, Environmental factors, and the Gastric Cancer risk in the European Population. He has been the principal investigator in several multicenter collaborative epidemiological studies on environmental factors, nutrition and cancer of the lung, stomach, urinary bladder and pleural mesothelioma. He is professor and coordinator on Cancer Epidemiology in the Master of Public Health at the Pompeu Fabra University in Barcelona, Spain.




Ritva R. Butrum, Ph.D. - Dr. Butrum is an internationally recognized authority in the field of diet, nutrition and cancer prevention. After holding the position of Vice President for Research at the American Institute for Cancer Research (AICR) in Washington, DC, she currently serves as a Senior Science Advisor at the same organization. In 1983 Dr. Butrum initiated the Diet and Cancer Branch (DCB) within the Division of Cancer Prevention and Control of the National Cancer Institute (NCI), National Institutes of Health (NIH). Dr. Butrum was instrumental in enlarging and supporting the Clinical Nutrition Research Units program at the NCI. She collaborated with the Food and Drug

Administration, the Committee on Data for Science and Technology (CODATA), the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations, and the agriculture ministries of many countries, in efforts to improve the quality and accessibility of food composition data. She was a representative for the Union of Nutritional Sciences to CODATA for eight years. Dr. Butrum received her Ph.D. in food science from the University of Maryland at College Park, M.S. degree in nutrition biochemistry from the University of California at Los Angeles (Fulbright Fellowship), and her B.S. degree in foods and nutrition from the University of Helsinki, Finland. She has published extensively in the scientific literature.



Luis Nin - Graduated and specialized in intensive care in Montevideo, Uruguay. Currently Dr Nin is a specialist in Clinical Nutrition and Enteral and Parenteral Nutrition. Former president of Nutrition Uruguayan Society (1983-1985). Presidente of International Confederation of National Societies of Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition.



 **Rafael Figueredo Grijalba** - Graduated and specialized in Nutrition in Assuncion, Paraguay. Currently dr Rafael is chief of department of Nutrition at Paraguayan University -Hospital de Clínicas, Facultad de Ciencias Médicas, Universidad Nacional de Asunción – Paraguay; and Assistant Professor at the Medical College- Facultad de Ciencias Médicas. Universidad Nacional de Asunción - Paraguay. Ex President of Paraguayan Society of Nutrition and President **elected** of FELAMPE - Federación Latinoamericana de Terapia Nutricional, Nutrición Clínica y Metabolismo – (2008 – 2010).



Rod Dashwood - Graduated in Toxicology and Immunology, and specialized in Environmental & Molecular Toxicology; Dr Dashwood acquired a PhD in Genetic Toxicology at University of Portsmouth, England. He has worked as Research associate and associate professor in US (Oregon and a Hawaii. Currently he is Director, Cancer Chemoprotection Program, Linus Pauling Institute. His expertise is Antimutagenesis, cancer chemoprevention, dietary factors, colorectal cancer; heterocyclic amines; tea polyphenols/antioxidants; cell cycle; Apc/-catenin (Wnt) signaling; in vivo cancer models; histone deacetylase (HDAC) inhibition and chromatin remodeling, epigenetic events in cancer. **Have 115 peer-reviewed articles; not including 10 chapters in books).**
